History to Remember!



On August 1, 1956, the burial of a capsule containing records of Fremont Centennial and other 100th anniversary articles was held. Fremonters were invited to attend. The capsule was welded air tight and encased in concrete before being dropped into its resting place near the courthouse steps, not to be dug up for 100 years.

VOTING QUALIFICATIONS

To qualify to register to vote you must be a resident of this county for at least 1 day prior to the Election and obtain the minimum age of 18 before the General Election date of any year. The only trick to this requirement is that the deadline for registering to vote at any election is 2 Fridays before the election. You can register at the office of County Clerk, Drivers' Examiners, state and federal agencies, or by mail by calling our office for the forms. There are voter registration forms on the county's website at www.dodgecounty.nebraska.gov/ under County Offices and Election Commissioner. Once registered, the only time you would have to reregister would be if your name would change, your address would change, or you wish to change political party affiliation. Mail-in registrations for new voters must be postmarked by the 3rd Friday prior to an election. The County Clerk can take registrations in office up until the 2nd Friday before elections.



About Nebraska's New Voter ID Law

Nebraska's New Voter ID Law, LB514, requires all registered Nebraska voters to present a photo ID when voting in any election in Nebraska beginning with the May 14, 2024, Primary Election.

How voter ID will work:

Voting in person at the polls: Present an original photo ID (no photocopy or *electronic image) or vote provisionally.

Voting early at the Election Office: Present an original photo ID (no photocopy or *electronic image) or vote provisionally.

Voting early by mail: Write driver's license/state ID number on ballot application **OR** enclose a copy of photo ID **OR** provide reasonable *impediment certification with your ballot application.

If you forget your ID, you will fill out a provisional ballot. For your ballot to count, you will need to present an original photo ID (no photocopy or *electronic image) to the county election office on or before the Tuesday after the election.

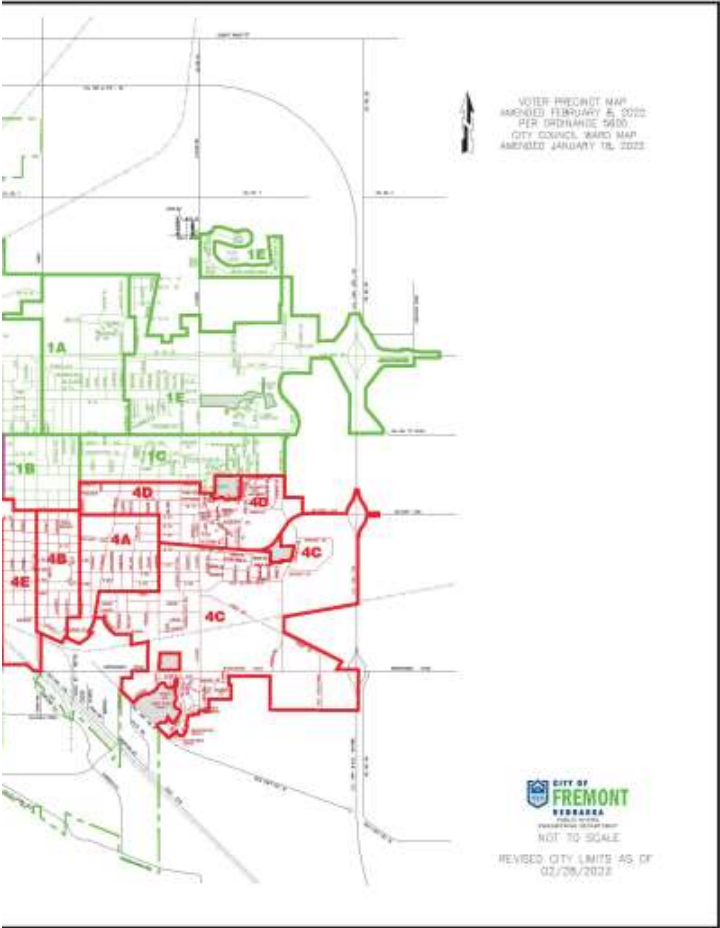
If you don't have an ID, you can get a state ID for free (for voting purposes) from the Nebraska DMV. You will need to bring certain documents to get a state ID, so check with the DMV website ahead of your visit.

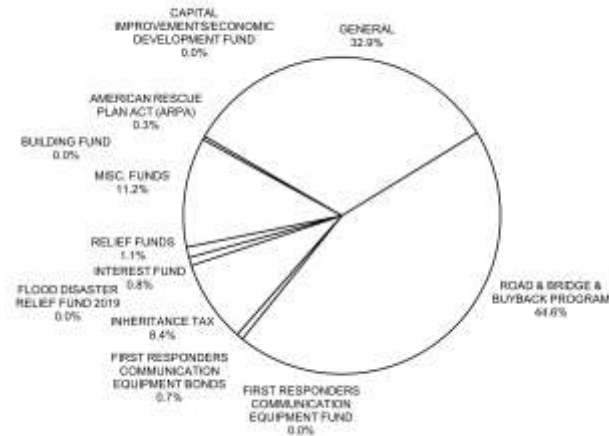

Anticipated Miscellaneous Collections 2023-2024



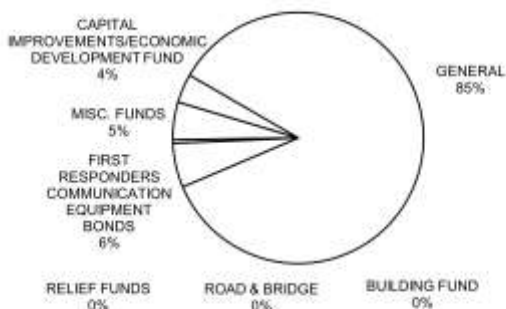

HOW TO FIGURE YOUR TAXES CHECKLIST:

Check what taxable districts your residence lies in.

Obtain the total Consolidated Tax Levy by adding the levies of each taxable district of your residence.

Check the Assessed Value of the property, business, or motor vehicle to see if it is accurate.

Divide the amount of Assessed Value by 100 and then multiply the answer by the consolidated tax levy-the final answer is your tax.

Check for exemptions and subtract the exemption credits.

Now, think about how to pay for them at the treasurer's office or on-line at <https://dodge.gworks.com/> (If paying on-line, click on the \$ sign and enter your name, parcel # or address.)

EXAMPLE:

Suppose I live in the City Limits of Fremont and the Assessed Value of my property is \$100,000. Assume a Homestead Exemption of \$30,000.
